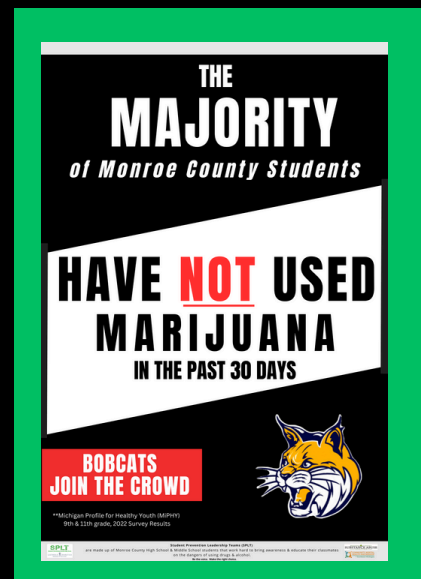
MONROE COUNTY STUDENT PREVENTION LEADERSHIP TEAMS (SPLT) COMPLETE AN ANNUAL MARIJUANA INITIATIVE TO EDUCATE THEIR PEERS ABOUT THE DANGERS OF MARIJUANA USE.

93% Monroe County High School and Middle School students surveyed identified at least three ways that marijuana use can have a **negative effect on their lives.**

92% Monroe County High School and Middle School students surveyed recognized the **long term effects** of marijuana use and 90% acknowledged that **marijuana is an addictive substance.**

92% Monroe County High School and Middle School Students surveyed recognized that it is **not safe to drive or ride in the car with someone who is under the influence of marijuana.**

93% Monroe County High School and Middle School students surveyed were able to identify **healthy ways to cope with stress and anxiety** without using marijuana



Monroe County High Schools showcased personalized banners featuring positive messaging about marijuana use amongst our youth in Monroe County. This initiative was informed by marijuana use data from the 2022 Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth Survey results.
